Committee's Purpose

To review and provide advice respecting accessibility issues affecting residents of the City of Richmond Hill



Committee's Mandate

- To provide advice and comments to Council and staff in each year with regards to the preparation, implementation and effectiveness of its multi-year accessibility plan
- To respond to Council's request for advice
- To receive presentations from staff



Requirements to consult with the AAC

- When establishing, reviewing and updating multi-year accessibility plans
- Provide advice on accessibility for people with disabilities on buildings that the City:
 - Constructs
 - Purchases
 - Significantly renovates
 - Leases or declares a municipal capital facility

Requirements to consult with the AAC

- The AAC will provide advice on the accessibility of:
 - Parks
 - Trails
 - Outdoor paths of travel



Examples of Information Shared at AAC

- Updates on Inclusion Services in the City Culture and Recreation programs
- Updates on the City's Active Projects
- Discussion items regarding proposed changes to provincial accessibility legislation
- Upper-tier municipal accessibility initiatives
- Electric Scooters in Richmond Hill

Committee Composition

- The Accessibility Advisory Committee is composed of:
 - Mayor (ex-officio);
 - One member of Council;
 - Eleven citizen members



Meeting Schedule

- The committee will meet every second month, at 3 p.m.
- Members are expected to attend all regularly scheduled meetings
