

MUSEUM *of the streets*

When you think of a museum, you might picture a big institutional building full of artifacts in cases, a maze of galleries and long, straight corridors. Richmond Hill's Museum of the Streets changes that - taking away the four walls of a traditional museum and opening the heritage of the City for all to see.

Museum of the Streets is a journey of discovery. You are your own tour guide. The distinctive green and tan signs direct you through the streets of historic Richmond Hill, showing the obvious - and not so obvious - signposts to our fascinating past. Museum of the Streets allows you to do as much or as little as you wish. Make the journey at your own pace, whenever you like. This innovative museum is always open. There is no admission charge other than your own time and interest in the City.

Museum of the Streets is a feature of the Richmond Hill Heritage Centre, operated by the Community Services Department. With 11 sign stations on the map, start your journey with an introductory panel at the Richmond Hill Heritage Centre, Amos Wright Park, 19 Church Street North.

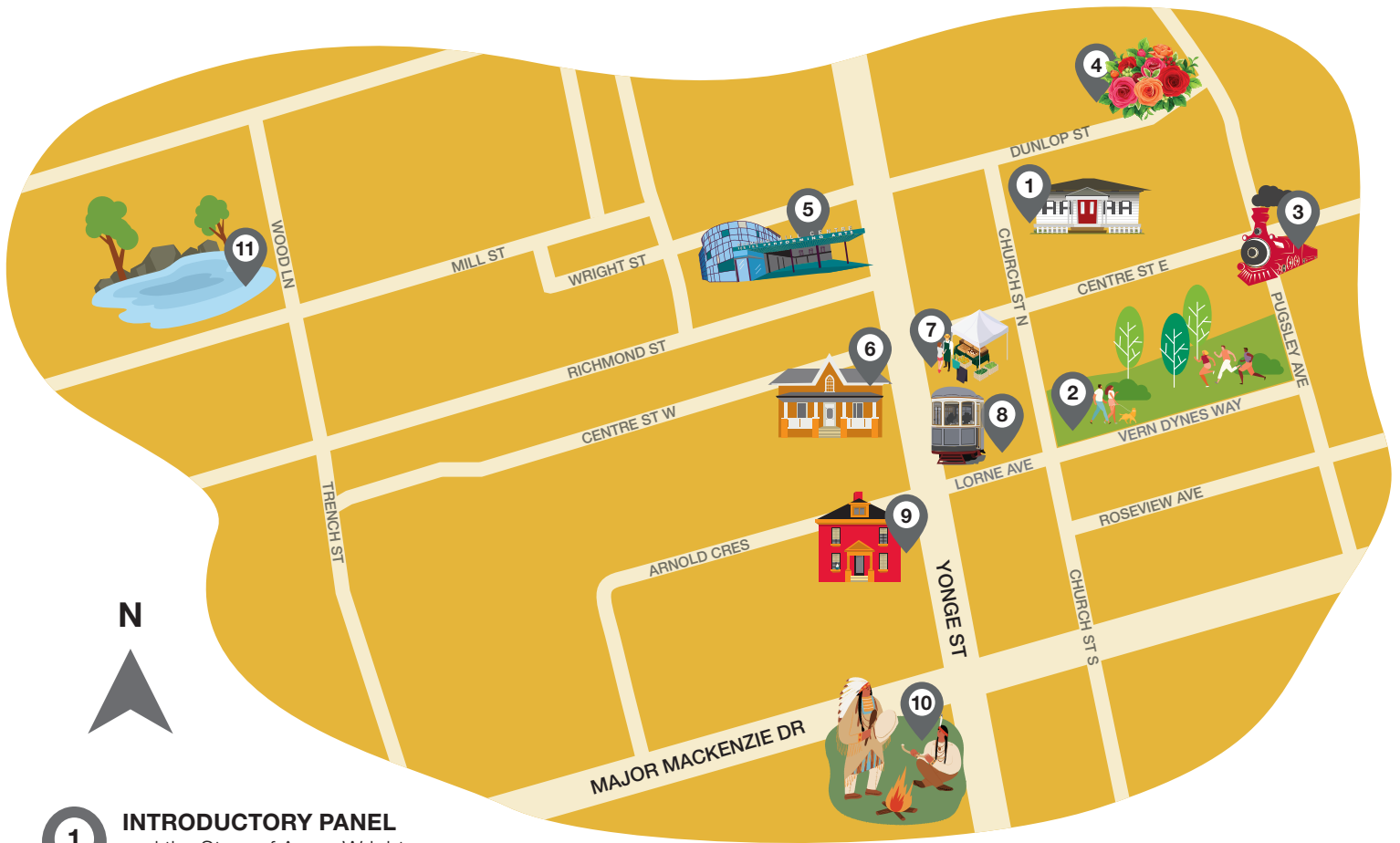
