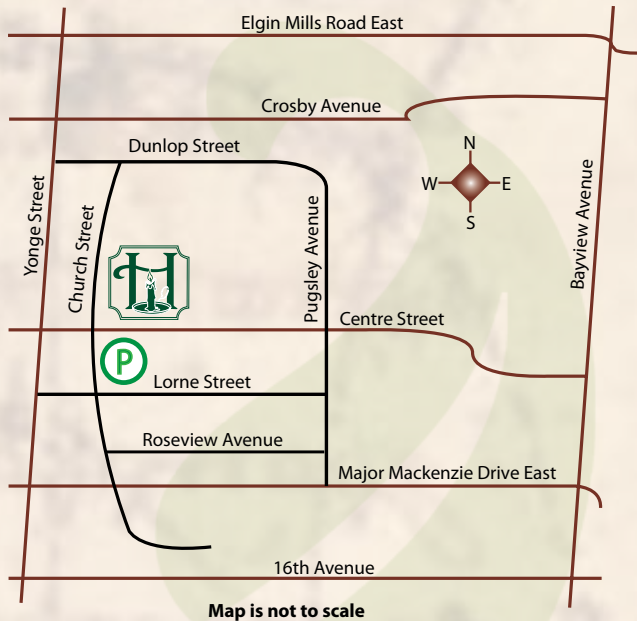

Richmond Hill's Museum of the Streets changes that-it takes away the four walls of the traditional museum and opens the heritage of the Town for all to see.

The Museum of the Streets is a journey of discovery. You are the tour guide. The distinctive green and tan signs direct you through the streets of Old Richmond Hill, showing the obvious - and not so obvious - signposts to our fascinating past. The Museum of the Streets is designed to allow you to do as much or as little as you wish. Make the journey at your own pace, whenever you like. This innovative museum is always open. There is no admission charge other than your time and interest in the Town.

The Museum of the Streets is a feature of the Richmond Hill Heritage Centre, operated by the Community Services Department. The map shows 11 sign stations, with the introductory panel at Amos Wright Park.

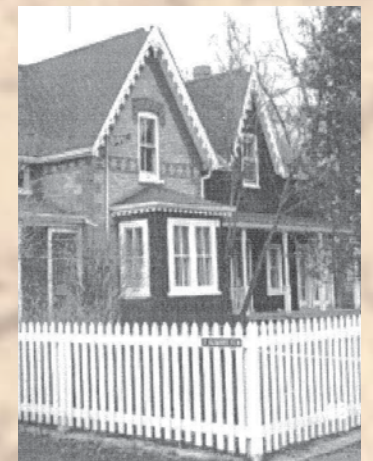

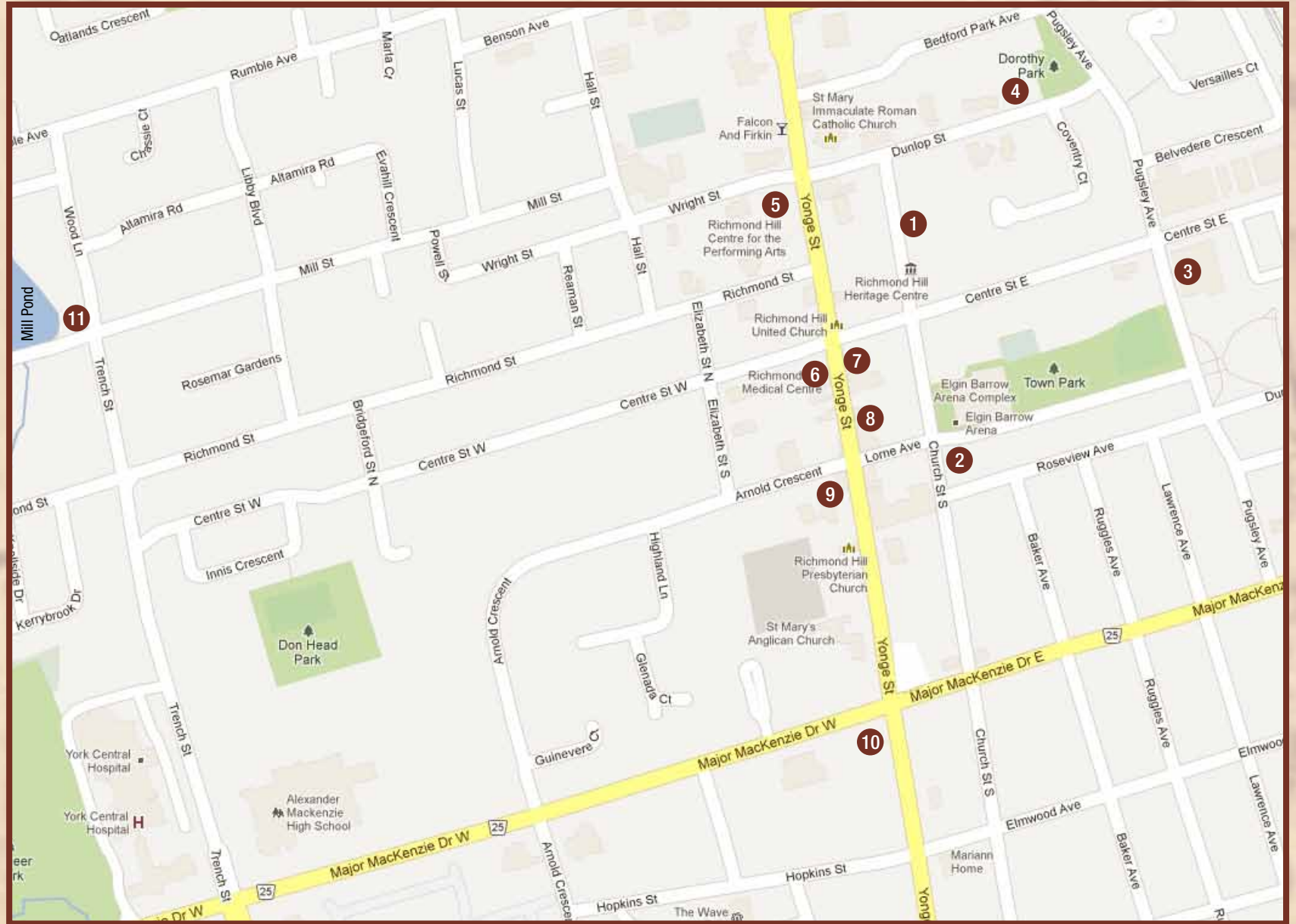
